  - 1 Bali, largely a Hindu Island, is deeply influenced by Buddhism and ancestor worship. I have never seen a greater overlap of religion and culture. There are beautiful stone temples every few meters, but, interestingly, without any deities except for an occasional shiva linga. People are very ritualistic. They primarily worship their ancestors and nature, specifically mother earth, the rituals are inherently simple.
  - 2 We stayed on the outskirts of the tourist hub, surrounded by picture-perfect trees, paddy fields and beautiful architecture. Locals were gentle and friendly. The growing community of outsiders here is not the kind that seeks air-conditioned offices but rather, a life closer to nature and with more freedom to create. The place is safe and, to top it off, has high-speed internet.
  - 3 Ubud attracts many 'digital nomads' who trade, consult, teach and study online. The Europeans are happy to escape the winter chill and high cost of living in their countries. Many come yearning for a life where body, mind and spirit are unplugged from the chatter of mass media and mindless development.
  - 4 Hubud (Hub-in-Ubud), the first collaborative working space in Bali, is home to a diverse community of local and visiting creatives, techies, entrepreneurs and change makers. Its website says, "Come join a community of people who are quietly changing the way we work, live and bring ourselves to the world."
  - 5 My belief that individual and collective wellbeing are so interdependent was reaffirmed. My own energies calmed down and I became more embracing of the surroundings, unlike in the city where I struggle to be centred and when I am, it is despite my surroundings.
  - 6 The rootedness in playful and meaningful and the sprinkling of global ideas and initiatives, both playful and meaningful, have given rise to something quite special in Ubud. Having said that, one cannot escape to such havens all the time. So the challenge is how to create an Ubud mindset wherever we live. And yet not live in a bubble but remain intensely engaged with the things that matter, give a sense of purpose to our lives and make living worth it all.

  - 1 New Delhi: Kerala, as per 2021 data, has the maximum proportion (16.5%) of elderly people in its population, followed by Tamil Nadu (13.6%), Himachal Pradesh (13.1%), Punjab (12.6%) and Andhra Pradesh (12.4%), according to a government report.
  - 2 The proportion is the least in Bihar (7.7%) followed by Uttar Pradesh (8.1%) and Assam (8.2%), according to the report of the Technical Group on Population Projections for India and States for 2011-2036, whose findings have been cited in the 'Elderly in India 2021' document released on Thursday by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MOSPI).
  - 3 The projections for 2031 show that Kerala will have the maximum proportion (20.9%) of elderly people in its population, followed by Tamil Nadu (18.2%), Himachal Pradesh (17.1%), Andhra Pradesh (16.4%) and Punjab (16.2%), according to the report. It cited data to show that the general population has grown by 12.4% during 2011-2021, in comparison to around 18% in the earlier decade, while the elderly population grew by 36% in each of the last two decades (2001-2011 and 2011-2021). High growth rate in elderly population compared to general population was also observed earlier in the two decades between 1961 and 1981, the report said.
  - 4 The growth in elderly population has been attributed to the longevity of life achieved because of economic well-being, better healthcare and medical facilities and reduction in fertility rates.
  - 5 Old age dependency ratio provides a clearer picture of the number of persons aged 60-plus per 100 persons in the age group of 15-59 years. The report said that an increasing trend has been observed in the old age dependency ratio it has risen from 10.9% in 1961 to 14.2% in 2011 and is further projected to increase to 15.7% and 20.1% in 2021 and 2031, respectively. The projected dependency ratio for females and males is 14.8% and 16.7% respectively in 2021.
